

Updated School Masking and Childcare Guidance

Governor Murphy <u>has announced</u> that masks and facial coverings will no longer be mandated for students, staff or visitors in schools and childcare centers effective March 7, 2022. Prior to the mandate being lifted, the NJDOH will release guidance to help school districts update their policies to align with the unique needs of their setting and school population.

The NJDOH also updated <u>"COVID-19 Public Health</u> <u>Recommendations for Operating Childcare Programs"</u> to align with the current CDC isolation/quarantine guidance.

Updated Guidance for COVID-19 Home Based/Self-Tests

On Feb 3rd the NJDOH updated considerations for COVID-19 home-based/self tests. While homebased tests offer accessible and affordable testing options, results may be difficult to interpret and leaves public health action to the test taker.



Persons who test positive for COVID-19 should notify their healthcare provider or local health department if they are concerned about their health or have questions on what they should do to protect those around them. Most importantly, they should **immediately isolate** away from others, **notify** their **close contacts** and if applicable, **notify** their worksite, school or daycare so that precautions can be taken.

There are also several instances where home-based testing needs special attention. When **ruling out** COVID-19 infection with compatible symptoms or having had close contact with a positive individual, a single negative self test **should not** be considered sufficient to rule out infection and return to normal activities. After a negative self-test, the symptomatic individual/ close contact should take a **second** self-test at least **24 hours** after the first one or seek a test administered by a healthcare professional (antigen/rapid or PCR test).

Other considerations should be taken for previously positive (in the last 90 days) individuals looking to be exempt from quarantine. If a **positive self-test was reported at the time it was taken** to public health, a healthcare provider, the individuals employer or school—and the test result can be verified by that agency, the individual would not need to be tested again or quarantine for 90 days after the positive results. If the positive self-test cannot be verified, the individual would have to quarantine. For example, if a school-age child tests positive for COVID-19 and their parent or caregiver contacts the school to **report the positive result at the time it was taken**, that child would not have to quarantine for 90 days after the **positive result**. If the school is **not notified at the time the test was taken** and the school cannot verify the positive result, the **child may have to quarantine**.
