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A Letter from the Health Officer:

Dear Colleagues, Partners, and Friends,

I am pleased to share the Bernards Township Health Department's **2023 Annual Report** with our communities. The work we do in Public Health is challenging, complex, and ever-changing with a constant responsibility of protecting and improving the health and wellbeing of our communities. It is my hope that these pages will capture the essence of the work performed by our talented staff. We are grateful to our community partners and to all residents of Bernards Township, Bernardsville Borough, Peapack and Gladstone Borough (Somerset County) and Chester Borough, Mendham Borough, and Long Hill Township (Morris County). Our goal is to provide the best public health services and protect the health of the residents we serve.

This past year has been full of grant applications, and we are reaping the rewards from our diligent work. The Strengthening Local Public Health Capacity program, COVID-19 Vaccination Supplemental Funding program, and the Enhancing Local Public Health Infrastructure program have provided greater capacity in terms of staffing, national accreditation, outbreak preparedness, response capacity and more. Our department also received a state-funded Project Firstline Grant that was intended to educate community partners in infection control and prevention. In addition, we received the first installment of the Opioid settlement money geared towards youth services, substance misuse and mental health. Other grant programs include radon testing and the City Dashboard, which showcases local data intended to advance health equity. These funds have streamlined our ability to provide effective prevention programs.

All environmental services were in full gear with many lead cases that needed immediate attention and follow-up. The environmental staff completed all inspections of over 425 food establishments and other inspections outlined in this report. Health Education also provided an array of fabulous nutrition, heart-healthy and chronic disease programs. It has been a great year with an excellent team of fine professionals.


We are happy to share the exciting work we are doing. It has been a balancing act of leaving the large volume of COVID-19 work behind while embracing the many public health needs of our communities. In December, we renewed all five (5) Interlocal Public Health Services contracts for an additional three years and contracted with a new Public Health Visiting Nursing services agency, Community VNA in Somerville.

Lastly, it is with a heavy heart and with great joy that I formally write to inform you of my retirement. After 41 wonderful years with the Bernards Township Health Department, I have decided to begin a new adventure in my life. My last day will be March 31, 2024. I loved my life's work and had the pleasure of working with so many talented people throughout the years. I've had the privilege of living in Bernards Township and raising two wonderful young men. This was truly my dream job. I was afforded the opportunities to excel and have many incredible experiences.

Every day was a new day serving our communities, helping so many people while learning so much. Who would have thought that the last few years of my career would have been the ultimate experience, "a global pandemic". I am proud of the fine work my department and I accomplished for all six (6) municipalities within our jurisdiction.

I will look fondly on the support and kindness I received from the Board of Health members and especially Dr. John Salaki, BOH President, Bernards Township Committee, administration, and coworkers.







- The Strengthening Local Public Health Capacity Program is a non-competitive grant funding opportunity offered to all eligible non-LINCS Agency local health departments (LHDs) to boost public health capacity during the COVID-19 response. Bernards Township Health Department was awarded **\$274,735** for the project period 7/1/2022 – 6/30/2023, as well as an additional **\$495,411** for the project period 7/1/2023 – 6/30/2024.

- Funding categories include:
 - a). Outbreak Preparedness (OP)** to strengthen outbreak preparedness/response capacity by reimbursing eligible COVID-19 and other infectious disease-related expenses - **\$21,606** (2022-2023), **\$30,008** (2023-2024)
 - b). Local Health Outreach Coordinator (LHOC)** to hire full-time personnel to assess, mitigate, and respond to populations disproportionately affected by the social and health impacts of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases - **\$123,529** (2022-2023), **\$183,822** (2023-2024)
 - c). Infectious Disease Preparedness Generalist (IDPG)** to hire full-time personnel to assist with outreach to populations disproportionately affected by COVID-19 and other infectious diseases, POD planning, logistics, testing, and contact tracing, etc. - **\$129,600** (2022-2023), **\$192,216** (2023-2024)
 - d). Public Health Accreditation (ACC)** to strengthen public health infrastructure and transform governmental public health by supporting LHDs seeking voluntary national public health accreditation through the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB). **\$89,365** (2023-2024)

- **LHOC Deliverables:**
 - Managed all program activities and finances of state-funded grants to comply with NJDOH requirements.
 - Created and submitted quarterly progress reports encapsulating all program activities during the quarter.

 - Participated in weekly evening and weekend vaccination clinics.
 - Worked with underserved populations and faith-based organizations to encourage vaccine uptake.
 - Created and submitted quarterly progress reports encapsulating all program activities during the quarter.
 - Vaccinated individuals aged 5 years and older at weekly/monthly vaccination clinics.
 - Vaccinated homebound and disabled individuals.
 - Maintained inventory of clinical supplies necessary for vaccine clinics.
 - Partnered, planned, and implemented vaccination and other health-related screening activities with critical organizations including churches and FQHCs.
 - Partnered with trusted faith-based organizations to conduct educational sessions among racial and ethnic minority groups.
